From the Pastor's Pen

My friends,

February is the month we celebrated love, in particular romantic love on St. Valentine's Day, but love in general, too. I think that may be one of the differences in the relationship between God and the people of God in the Old and New Testaments. In the Old Testament it's an "if ... then" relationship between God and Israelites. God says, "If you obey me, then I will love you." For instance, in Deuteronomy 30:15-16, God says, "See, I have set before you today life and prosperity, death and adversity. If you obey the commandments of the Lord your God that I am commanding you today, by loving the Lord your God, walking in his ways, and observing his commandments, decrees, and ordinances, then you shall live and become numerous, and the Lord your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to possess." In the New Testament, it's more of God's loving humanity first and humanity responding to the love of God. It is not unlike what John wrote in one of his epistles: "We love because (God) first loved us." (1 John 4:19) God is the first mover in love. Humanity responds to that divine love by loving God and neighbor.

Dr. Shirley Guthrie writes about this love in the doctrine of justification.

Dr. Guthrie says:

.... Justification by grace, as a 'gift' (Rom. 3:24), means quite simply: You do not have to buy God's love and acceptance, because you are *already* loved and accepted by God – without any qualification or prerequisites. God does not say, "I will love you *if* you are good, *if* you prove yourself worthy, *if* you do so and so, *if* you first love me." God does not even say, "I will love you *if* you first have faith in me or *if* you first humiliate yourself and grovel on the ground before me." God says simply, "I love you just as you are – *you*, not your righteousness, your humility, your faith, or your accomplishments of one kind or another.

That does not mean that God's love is blind. God sees us as we really are. Justification is a big "nevertheless."

Justification means that despite the fact that things are not right in our inner lives and our personal relationships, God forgives and accepts us....

How do we know this is true? Because 'while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.... (W)hile we still were sinners Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:6-8) God is not for those who first do what they can to help themselves, but for those who cannot help themselves.... Christ means that God's love is not a reward for what we have done or confess that we have not done, but a *gift* given absolutely freely, with no strings attached." (319, Christian Doctrine (revised edition))

God loves us unconditionally. There is no "if you are good and obey, then I will love you." God really loves *us* just as we are. Once we know God loves us, how can we not love our Creator God with all our heart, and with all our soul, and with all our mind, and with all our strength?



Invite a Friend to Sunday School in February!!




February 12th is the last day for pictures!


Bring your Good Samaritan Donations next month on Sun., March 12th.

The first blood donation opportunity at FPC in 2023 occurred on Jan. 18th in our fellowship hall with 23 donors yielding 21 units of blood.

This is our second year for providing space for Red Cross to collect much needed blood and will be continuing once a quarter during 2023. Since beginning this joint effort with Red Cross, we have seen an increase in donor numbers from the teens to the 20's, averaging 25 to 30 scheduled appointments each time. Much appreciation goes to the members of our congregation who donate blood and those who donate time to assist with registration and managing the refreshments which are important to those who have just donated a pint of their blood. Thanks to PDO teachers who helped take down tables and move chairs in preparation for the equipment Red Cross workers moved in for the day and to the church volunteers who helped restore the room for Wednesday night activities. Thanks to our church secretary who does much of the behind the scene work that is always necessary for a program to succeed.

It takes many hands to bring off a successful blood drive and thankfully we are blessed in this. Our next blood drive is scheduled for Wednesday April 26, 2023. Please consider signing up for an appointment and always keep this project in your prayers.


