Jesus called the disciples to be aware of what time it was because he brought division and not peace. I'd much rather have peace! For sure in the house of faithful Jews in the time of Jesus, when a mother or a son became a Christian, there was division in the family, a mother against daughter or son against father. Jesus presented a crisis to the disciples that required that they make a choice that was going to cause division within their families. "Follow me," Jesus said, "and you will know division and not peace." This division happens today in some families. There are still divisions over faith choices. At times unity in peace cannot be found in a family or community, especially when the truth is at stake. Then careful discernment with patient prayer may be needed to move forward. Come to worship and fellowship this Sunday.

Preparation for Worship (reading before the service for quiet meditation)

Thinking about the hard saying of today's Gospel of Luke reading, Dr. Charles B. Cousar writes: "From the beginning of Luke's story, promises of peace have been central to the presence of Jesus (1:79; 2:14; 8:48; 19:38), and peace is the message the Seventy are commissioned to preach (10:5-6). But disciples, both ancient and modern, are eager for an instant peace, a trouble-free fulfillment of the promised salvation. Jesus' words are jolting because they make it plain that there is no peace without conflict, no salvation without rejection. Jesus himself faces that at Jerusalem, and the disciples need expect nothing different. But rather than being signs of defeat, rejection and conflict are incorporated in the divine plan." (Cousar, Gaventa, McCann, and Newsome, Texts for Preaching – Year C, p. 477)
