From the Pastor's Pen

My friends in Christ,

Every year we are called by God to consider what we give to the church on Stewardship Sunday. A good way to look at stewardship is from a very biblical perspective: the need of the giver to give, not the church to receive. The central question is not, "What do the bills total?" Instead, the key question addresses our spirituality as faithful Christians.

Jesus told the rich young man in Matthew 19:16-22, who wanted to know what he could do to inherit eternal life, "If you wish to enter into life, keep the commandments." He said, "I have! What do I lack?" Jesus responded, "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell all you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." Stewardship isn't about money, but relationship with God instead.

Church growth guru and consultant the Reverend Herb Miller suggests that the central question for stewardship is "What does God call me to give as an expression of my relationship with God?" (116, The Vital Congregation) Stewardship is a very spiritual act between you and God. Miller writes about stewardship and the tithe in Hebrew society being like income tax paid to the "Department of Eternal Revenue." Miller then writes:

(T)o tithe was to perform their basic duty. They assumed the first 10 percent belonged to God already....

Yet, there is another sense in which the tithe is not what Jesus is talking about. Jesus answers the question of 'How much is enough?' by saying that this is not the question! As Jesus does in all his teaching, what he says about giving goes far beyond any legalistic use of the Old Testament. Jesus teaches that our giving to God cannot be reduced to a 10 percent formula. Our most basic stewardship is to give our whole heart to God's work (God's spiritual kingdom). Our gift of money is a symbol of that total self-giving, but money itself can never be classified as our ultimate stewardship; that is always a matter of the heart. The Pharisees tended to 'materialize their spiritual relationship with God' into rituals and offerings. Jesus did the opposite: He 'spiritualized the material' into an expression of loving relationship with God and unselfish giving to help the less fortunate.

(52-53, Money (Isn't) Is Everything: What Jesus Said about the Spiritual Power of Money)

So, to practice our stewardship, we give our whole heart to God and respond out of gratitude to God for all God's blessing and especially for the love of God we know through the sacrifice of our Lord Jesus. When we come to offer our stewardship to God and the church, thanks is really all we are saying to God for such a blessed relationship. Let us cheerfully say, "Thanks!" on this Sunday, November 6th.




Wonderful on Wednesday's

Be looking for other PW activities that are coming this Fall as we enjoy the fellowship with the women in our congregation.




Update


