Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

A couple of years ago we spent the summer looking at “hard sayings” from the Bible. How do we interpret the coming of Jesus again in the future? Do we need to worry about the second coming of Jesus? Jesus said, “Nope! No need to worry about what you’re going to eat or what you’re going to wear.” Luke encourages us not to worry and not to be afraid, for our Father God gives His flock the kingdom as a gift. With similar words as last week’s scripture reading, Jesus told the disciples to give God a thought in their decisions and to sell their possessions and give to the poor; in other words, to store up treasures in heaven where neither thief nor moth destroys. Jesus told them to be ready: to be dressed for action, loins girded, and lamps lit like slaves waiting for their master to return from a wedding. Don’t worry. Be ready. Jesus gave a similar message about the unexpected hour the thief comes to burglarize the house. Be ready, because no one knows the hour. What does Jesus’ “end times” message mean for First Prez Shelbyville today from Luke 12:32-40? How do we “slaves” get ready for the master to return?

Remember the Sunday morning gathering in the fellowship hall begins around 9:00 a.m. for hot coffee, a morning snack, and friendly fellowship. Then, come upstairs to worship God together as the body of Christ at 10:00 a.m.
