From the Pastor's Pen


My friends,

Sunday school is the perfect time to learn about such unusual words as “mammon.” In the more modern translations of the New Testament the word is translated as “wealth” (CEB), “money” (CEV), or as the Amplified Bible parenthetically adds after the word “mammon” in 16:13: “(that is, your earthly possessions or anything else you trust in and rely on instead of God).” The Amplified extended translation captures the meaning of the word quite nicely. You will most likely here some more about this passage on Sunday, September 18, which is the second Sunday of the new Sunday school year, as we continue in The Feasting on the Word Series. The parable is the rather controversial parable that uses a “dishonest manager” (CEV and ESV) or “this rascally steward” (JB Phillips) to describe the manager of the master’s property. Usually, the master in the parable can be interpreted as playing the God role and the protagonist as the just Christian. But in Luke 16:1-13 there are some ambiguous boundaries that leave the interpreter in a grey area about both the master and the protagonist. I do not like living in the grey, but I believe that is what good Presbyterians are open to doing in our modern everyday world.

So what does the student of the Bible and Christian do with a parable like this one in Luke that does not clearly state its meaning as directly as the Good Samaritan or the Prodigal Son does? I think there must be opportunity for the Christian to wrestle with a scripture passage like “the parable of the dishonest manager,” the title the NRSV (CE) gives it. Wrestling with the scripture like Jacob wrestled with the angel (quite possibly God) in Genesis 32:22-32 is what Christians do in their diligent study of the Bible. Understanding what the Bible means for Christians today is far from plain and simple in a number of the biblical stories. Luke 16:1-13 is one of those stories that demand a more complicated interpretation. Isn’t that usually true when it comes to our possessions (mammon) and us? We cannot serve two masters, can we? I encourage you and your family to find a class in Sunday school, one of the adult, youth, or children’s classes, and come regularly to grow in the wisdom and stature of Jesus Christ.

May the peace and wisdom of our Lord Jesus be with you





Women of the Church




