### Dear Friends,

In an article published on June 14, 2016, by Hanne Elisabeth Tidnam, I was reminded the words "under God" were not a part of our national Pledge of Allegiance until they were added by an act of Congress on June 14<sup>th</sup>, 1954, as part of an anti-Soviet campaign in America during the Cold War days following World War II.

According to the article the Pledge of Allegiance as it was first written in 1892 by Francis Bellamy originally stated, "I pledge allegiance to my Flag and the Republic for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all." According to the article Bellamy had hoped and intended it to be a pledge that could be used for all nations.

And so, the pledge remained, from 1892-1954 when the words "under God" were added. With the Cold War in full swing and anti-Soviet sentiment running high something ignited an anti-Soviet campaign to add the words, "under God" to the pledge. In fact, it was a Presbyterian minister who may have been the catalyst for the change in wording.

The Reverend George M. Docherty, who was then the pastor of the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church where President Eisenhower worshipped, spent one Sunday sermon declaring this about the Pledge of Allegiance. "There is something missing" he avowed, "Indeed, apart from the mention of the phrase, 'the United States of America,' it could be the pledge of any republic. In fact, I could hear little Muscovites repeat a similar pledge to their hammer-and-sickle flag in Moscow."

A public outcry followed, and on June 15<sup>th</sup>, 1954, President Eisenhower made a speech celebrating Congress' resolution to add the words "under God" just the day before on Flag Day, June 14th, 1954.

As I survey the political and cultural landscape of my beloved nation today, I wonder if those words expressed more a wishful thinking than fact. It begs the question, "Have we ever truly been one nation?" Our history, past and present, would argue against that notion, that hope.

In his first inaugural address President Abraham Lincoln spoke of our nation's journey to becoming a "more perfect union." I wonder how far we may have come since those early pre-Civil War days.

As a nation we will always be under God's scrutiny and care, but let's not fool ourselves. We have never been one nation, there has always been an "us and them." Whether these demarcations were based on race, region, or religion the result has been the same. We have always been a divided nation, and I imagine we will always have our differences.

I guess the question is, will we be able to rise about our differences to realize, as we are in the eyes of God, all the same? Or will we continue to allow our differences divide and define us as a nation? As candidate for the U.S. Senate, in his House Divided Speech, Abraham Lincoln wisely observed, "A house divided against itself cannot stand."

It is my prayer and my hope for this nation I love so dearly, one day we will be "one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all." It is my hope and prayer one day the vision of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. will be a reality, and we will judge people, not by the color of their skin, but by the content of their character.

When we, as a nation, have reached that level of maturity I believe the words, "one nation under God" will be a reality, and not just wishful thinking or anti-anything propaganda. In the meantime, it's up to you and me and other disciples of Jesus Christ to continue to sow the seeds of the gospel and trust that God will do the rest.

May God indeed bless America with unity as well as bounty.

# Report from PNC

During a Congregational Meeting held following the worship service on Sunday, June 13, 2021, the Pastor Nominating Committee, who was in unanimous agreement, nominated Dr. James Moran as First Presbyterian Church's next minister. The congregation voted via ballot to accept this nomination.

Dr. Moran is a graduate of Presbyterian College in Clinton, South Carolina where he majored in Psychology and Business Accounting. He received both his Masters in Divinity and his Doctorate in Ministry from Columbia Theological Seminary. He comes to us with over 30 years of experience in the pulpit.

Dr. Moran and his wife, Denise, are extremely excited about coming to Shelbyville. They spent eighteen years in Hermitage and they are very eager to "return home" to Middle Tennessee. Denise plays an integral part in Dr. Moran's ministry.
