Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

So, what is a Presbyterian? We now have four identifying beliefs of Presbyterians: a faithful stewardship that shuns ostentation and seeks proper use of the gifts of God's creation, a covenant life marked by a disciplined concern for order in the church according to the word of God, the election of the people of God for service as well as for salvation, and the sovereignty of God. A fifth tenet of the Reformed faith is "the recognition of the human tendency to idolatry and tyranny." (Book of Order, section F-2.05) Or, we may say it another way: humans are sinners. Not long after God created the earth, the story of how sin ruined paradise through Satan's rebellious work with the original couple Adam and Eve is the ongoing saga of sinning human beings. In the Book of Confessions and the Bible we find ample support for our human tendency to sin. The Second Helvetic Confession, chapter 8 "Of Man's Fall, Sin and the Cause of Sin," tells us about the source of sin and its effect: "By sin we understand that innate corruption of man which has been derived or propagated in us all from our first parents, by which, we, immersed in perverse desires and averse to all good, are inclined to all evil." Not a very pleasant understanding of who we are! This confession talks about the spiritual death sin brings on humanity and quotes Ephesians 2:1ff: "We were dead through trespasses and sins... and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind. But God, who is rich in mercy... even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ." It also quotes from Paul's letter to Rome: "As sin came into the world through one man and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all men sin." (Rom. 5:12) (Book of Confessions, 5.038) The Confession of 1967 talks about sin in more contemporary (though gender exclusive) terms: "In sin, men claim mastery of their own lives, turn against God and their fellow men, and become exploiters and despoilers of the world. They lose their humanity in futile striving and are left in rebellion, despair, and isolation." (Ibid, 9.12)

As we "claim mastery" of our "own lives," our sin is that we truly create God in our image and govern our own lives all by ourselves. We live with a mirror in front of ourselves. The Reformer John Calvin coined a phrase for how trapped in sin humanity is: total depravity. Now, I do not like to think of myself as being totally depraved, but without God whom I know in Jesus, I am left a sinner without hope because I cannot save myself from sin; no one can. I am lost, trapped, and totally depraved. As Paul wrote in Romans in his discussion on the all consuming power of sin, "For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me." (7:18-20) This sin is the sin of idolatry, which means to make something created ultimate rather than God the Creator. We make ourselves ultimate and worship the creature, whatever we desire and want to do, instead of worshipping the Creator only. We are not our own masters and gods.

A third creed that details this sin of idolatry is "The Theological Declaration of Barmen" written around 1934, which was the time the Third Reich and Hitler were building their power base in Germany. The Confessing Church in Germany put this Declaration together as a witness to the true church in Germany, not the state, which required an ultimate commitment to the state rather than God. Dr. Jack Rogers, former Moderator of the General Assembly, wrote, "In Reformed theology, atheism is not the problem. Idolatry is.... An idol is any humanly created thing to which people give their ultimate allegiance. Idolatry is giving our total commitment to something in the creation rather than to the Creator alone." (191, Presbyterian Creeds: A Guide to the Book of Confessions)

The Declaration states that Jesus is Lord, not the state. In its first article, after quoting John 14:6 and 10:1, 9, is written: “Jesus Christ, as he is attested for us in Holy Scripture, is the one Word of God which we have to hear and which we have to trust and obey in life and in death.” (8.11, Book of Confessions) We are freed from this idolatrous sin through our faith in Jesus Christ. It does not mean we won’t sin, but only that in Jesus we find forgiveness and the power to change our EGO, “Edging God Out,” as Methodist minister Adam Hamilton described sin in our Sunday school study of the Ten Commandments. The good news is that Presbyterians believe that the grace of God is more powerful than sin. That’s what we believe as Presbyterians.

PREPARATION FOR WORSHIP (Reading before service for quiet meditation):

The last words in Dr. Shirley Guthrie’s classic reformed theology: “Do you want to be born again to be a truly free, truly human man or woman – free to be yourself as you are free for the disturbing, demanding love of God and other human beings? Then you may enter the kingdom of God, no matter how sinful you may have been in your religious piety or lack of it, your immorality or morality. “That is the Good News addressed both to sinful outsiders and to sinful insiders. He came not to condemn the world but that the world – the whole world! – might be saved through him (John 3:16-17).”
