the leper, that love that healed the Syrophoenician (Gentile) woman's daughter, and that love that sent the Gerasene demoniac home from the tombs healed to tell the good news of Jesus and his love. I encourage you to sing both the hymns of Advent hopefully and the Christmas carols joyfully with the knowledge that Jesus is coming and Christmas is arriving. Prepare the way of the Lord!

Christmas time is coming and if you listen to your various news media pronouncements, all our gifts are in cargo ships off the coast of California. There are other options for gift giving to those interested in remembering family and friends by honoring them instead of giving an actual gift. Your Mission committee is suggesting you check out the PRESBYTERIAN GIVING CATALOG to fulfill your gift giving needs. This catalog contains items ranging in price from \$15 to \$5000. You purchase something like a sewing machine or hive of bees or kitchen kit just to name a few and these items are given to folks in developing countries to assist them in making a living. When we give to the Christmas Joy Offering, we share our love with the leaders of our Church — past, present and future – who point us to God.



Each Spring FPC gift committee is given the delightful task of selecting charitable organizations who have submitted requests to receive varying amounts of money from the Bailey and Lucy Evans Trust Fund. Below is a letter from Gloria Johnson representing the Rosenwald Community Center here in Shelbyville recounting what they did with their gift:

"With the help of the Bailey Evans Trust money, we have started a Fall garden in raised beds at the Rosenwald Community Center on Tillman Street. With the money we have purchased tee shirts for the children who are participating in the garden project, crafts for decorating their garden, stepping stones, crafts for the Fall and Christmas season and snacks and lunch on the days they meet to work in the garden. We are planning an outdoor outing on their Fall break. The children are so excited.

A plus with this project is the involvement of a few of the parents, two of which are fathers. I deem this project a success when fathers spend quality time with their children and volunteer to help. One father loves art and is doing art lessons with the children. I am more than excited for this adventure and look forward to next year's activities.

Thank you so much."

An additional note of explanation.....there were 16 to 20 children who participated in the garden project along with 2 fathers and several mothers all from the neighborhood around the Rosenwald Center. The garden produced turnip and mustard greens, kale, and some root veggies which the children and their parents sampled and declared tasty. The plans are to expand the garden to a tilled plot next Spring in order to raise summer vegetables.








Pastoral Care


Our Farewell to Cindy Lamb

There is just no other word for it....Cindy Lamb is a godsend.....she was sent by God. From the day she arrived, she was full of energy and ideas...and then COVID hit and shut the church down. But Cindy Lamb was not going to let a little ole global pandemic stop her mission of sharing the love of Christ with the youth and young children of this church. She made countless trips to the homes of the young people of this church to drop off Easter baskets, a bundle of books for the youth, and just little things to the children to let them know she was thinking of them. She set up Zoom Bible Studies with the youth. When the products arrived for Vacation Bible School the first year she was here....they weren't up to her standards so Cindy CREATED a VBS program to be used during a pandemic. Drive-by supply pick-ups, meeting via Zoom to share a story and to see the craft the children had made, and then a drive-thru celebration of completing VBS with cheerleaders and an appearance by Moses. When we began to "come out" of the COVID restrictions, she planned outings with the youth, had a REAL Easter Egg Hunt, organized Trunk or Treat, created a Sports VBS....and the list goes on and on.

Thank you Cindy. Thank you for arriving when we had no idea what was coming. Thank you for the hours spent with our children and youth talking to them about God. Thank you for the hours spent planning. Thank you for just being you and for the spark of joy you bring to everyone who knows you.

You are....a godsend and we know that God sent you to us. We will miss you but we were so blessed by you that we can't be sad. We're only grateful that God showed His goodness in sending us you.


