Service for the Lords Day Pentecost with Holy Communion

June 5, 2022

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

A third widely accepted rule of the interpretation of Scripture is *the Christological principle*. Dr. Guthrie writes that "Jesus Christ is the clearest revelation of who God is and what God promises and wills for faithful Christian life. Therefore, all scripture is to be interpreted in light of 'what Christ Jesus himself did and commanded' (*Scots Confession*, 18), in light of its witness to God's work of reconciliation in Christ' (*Confession of 1967*, I.C.2 (9.29, Book of Confessions))." (Shirley Guthrie, <u>Christian Doctrine (revised edition</u>), pp. 12-14) In light of the Jesus Christ we know and love, how do we live in a relationship with God and with one another, is a question we can ask ourselves.

If we read some of the brutality in the Old Testament that God sanctioned, how does that affect how we respond to our enemies in the light of Jesus's words to love our enemies in the Sermon on the Mount? (Matthew 5:43-48) What about the Bible's implications about the inferior status of women? For a correct understanding of a Christian view of women, we must interpret the scripture texts by how Jesus dealt with women. (ibid, 13) For instance, in the Gospel of John, worn out from his travels, Jesus sat down by a well in Samaria. When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus asked her, "Give me a drink." The Samaritan woman said to him, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?" John explained to the reader that Jews and Samaritans did not share things in common. Samaritans and Jews were not friends and neighbors. Jesus offered her living water to keep the thirst away spiritually, though she misinterpreted what he said to mean her physical need for water. He revealed her life story of having five husbands, not counting the one she was living with now." (John 4:1-26) Jesus, as He always ended up doing, treated this Samaritan woman with respect and kindness.

As we seek to interpret the Bible for today, the Christological principle helps us see life through the eyes of Jesus and with His compassion. To help us gain some understanding of the character of Jesus, we must spend time studying the stories about Jesus in the four Gospels and re-read His teachings and parables. It is good to let the life of Jesus guide our interpretation of the Bible and flavor our lives with His love and grace.
