Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

A fourth widely accepted rule of the interpretation of Scripture is the rule of faith. Once again, we begin with Dr. Shirley Guthrie and the Scots Confession to understand what this interpretative rule means. Dr. Guthrie writes:

Referring to such central Protestant convictions as confession of the unique authority of scripture and salvation by God's grace alone, the Scots Confession (chap. 18) says, "We dare not receive or admit any interpretation which is contrary to any point of our faith." The Declaration of Faith says more generally, "listening with respect to fellow believers past and present, we anticipate that the Holy Spirit will enable us to interpret faithfully God's word for our time and place" (chap. 6.3).

(Shirley Guthrie, Christian Doctrine (revised edition), pp. 13)

The Christian interprets scripture in today's context of the community of the church and within the Church's history of interpretation. We do not create a unique interpretation of the scriptures all by ourselves. Guided by the Holy Spirit, we listen to fellow believers "with respect." (Ibid, p. 13) Listening to the story of interpretation of the scripture yesterday and today helps us avoid eisegesis, our own personal narrow understanding of the scripture, that "me and my RC" Bible is all I need thinking. Today we have finally learned to listen to people who are different from us with respect to gender, race, class, culture, and national origin in order that we may broaden "our limited perspective" on what the scriptures say. As we seek to interpret the Bible for today, the rule of faith helps us see life through both the eyes of the historical church and people different from us so that we are able to see the love and grace of God more clearly. The rule of faith says that our biblical interpretation is informed by the faith of the church historically and in our present day.

In his commentary on "The Epistle to the Romans," Dr. Douglas Moo, Professor of New Testament, wrote about Paul's writing about justification by faith: "Again, though, Paul stresses this new relationship with God is available only for those who believe – it cannot be attained by works, or by circumcision, or by the law (3:27-4:25). . . . In both majors sections of 1:18-4:25, Paul shows how the revelation of God's righteousness erases distinctions between Jews and Gentiles: the Jew, like the Gentile, under the power of sin (3:9); the Jew, like the Gentile, can be justified only by faith (3:28-30)."




