Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

A sixth widely accepted rule of the interpretation of Scripture is *the study of scripture in its literary* and historical context. Once again referring to "The Second Helvetic Confession," you see the importance of this rule of interpretation:

.... But we hold that interpretation of the Scripture to be orthodox and genuine which is gleaned from the Scriptures themselves (from the nature of the language in which they were written, likewise according to the circumstances in which they were set down, and expounded in the light of like and unlike passages and of many and clearer passages).... (5.010, <u>Book of Confessions</u>)

The <u>Book of Confessions</u> also includes a more recent confession written in the 1960's that emphasizes the importance of this final rule for the interpretation of the scriptures. The "Confession of 1967" says:

The Scriptures, given under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, are nevertheless the words of men, conditioned by the language, through forms and literary fashions of the places and times at which they were written. They reflect views of life, history, and the cosmos which were then current. The church, therefore, has an obligation to approach the Scriptures with literary and historical understanding. As God has spoken his word in these diverse cultural situations, the church is confident that he will continue to speak through the Scriptures in a changing world and in every form of human culture. (Confession of 1967, I.C.2)

Dr. Shirley Guthrie encourages us not to be afraid to learn from the biblical scholars who investigate the scripture in its original languages, literary setting, and historical context because they help us discern what our ancestors were attempting to communicate back then. (14, Christian Doctrine (revised edition)) So, as we look at Galatians 5:1, 13-26 this coming Sunday, we must understand the context and purpose of Paul's letter to seek to hear what God may be saying to us today. What does Paul mean by the word "flesh" (5:13, 16-17, 19, 24)? How do Christians "become slaves to one another through love" (5:13)? How have we crucified the flesh (5:24)? The study of scripture in its literary and historical context of this letter of Paul to the churches of Galatia helps us faithfully interpret the scripture for both back then and also today.
