Sometimes it takes my hearing something more than once to embed it in my brain. I look forward to seeing you all this Sunday for "Rally Day" at 9:15 a.m. and worship at 10:00 a.m., as we kickoff our new year of Christian education and continue to grow "to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ." 
We hope you will make plans to join us for fellowship, food and fun. Bring your friends with you and join us on Sunday evenings. Dinner will be provided by a different family each week.
