It falls from the heavens onto us and we don't quite understand it or know how to respond to it. We don't understand how we got wet when we didn't do anything to get wet. We don't understand why it keeps falling onto us no matter what we do to shake it off. We scratch and sniff and roll around trying to make sense of it instead of just letting grace become part of the natural condition of our lives.

I pray that grace might fall on you and that you might enjoy it and accept it as a natural condition of your life even if you have to roll around in the grass a little.
