This morning I watched the local news from San Antonio, Texas on the internet to see what's going on where my son lives. The anchors mentioned that today is not only Friday the thirteenth, but that tonight there will be a full moon. The local weatherman then jokingly predicted a 30% chance of werewolves. Everybody on the set mimicked fright. Yuk, yuk, ha, ha.

But tonight there is real reason for concern in the Bahamas where high tide will occur at 8:32 pm, boosted by tropical cyclone #9. This new storm is following the path of Hurricane Dorian which just days ago slammed the upper Caribbean, the Bahamas, and coastal South and North Carolina. What's frightening is to see a functioning community become a dysfunctional catastrophic scene in twenty-four hours.

Damage from Dorian has been well documented: whole communities smashed flat by 185 mph winds as if a bomb had hit, trees stripped of leaves, homeless family fragments camped out on hot pavements without supplies, no relief in sight from the Bahamian government.

The Presbyterian Disaster Assistance agency has jumped into the middle of this situation, both in the Bahamas and in the Carolinas. PDA is working with relief agencies as well as local ministries and local church pastors to bring aid to families which have lost everything. With local infrastructure demolished, PDA is also establishing relief distribution processes.

If you wish to love your storm impacted neighbors as yourselves, you can make a donation to Presbyterian relief efforts this Sunday by writing a check to First Presbyterian Church Shelbyville with "Dorian" written on the memo line. The church will then send a congregational donation to PDA.

As pastor John Donne wrote centuries ago: Any man's death diminishes me because I am involved in mankind. And therefore never send to know for whom the bell tolls; it tolls for thee.
