This Sunday is the customary day for celebrating the baptism of Jesus. In some ways that baptism is very odd. Why would Emmanuel, God with us, need to be baptized? Why would this sinless, divine person need a divine blessing and redemption in the waters of grace?

Traditionally we see in the baptism of Jesus, the human person (rather than the divine person) of Christ being blessed by His divine Father and that blessing shows the world that Jesus is truly divine. The baptism connects Jesus to God Almighty in a way that all the angel choirs at Christmas did not.

So if His baptism gives Jesus identity, then our own baptisms also give us our identities. Jesus' baptism identified Him as God's own and our baptisms identify us as Jesus' own. We are more than voluntary followers of Jesus. We belong to Him and our baptism demonstrates His claim upon us.

That's a very different way of identifying ourselves than we customarily do. If someone asks us who we are, we usually name our family/ tribe/ work/ church in about that order. But this Sunday we are invited to identify ourselves, first and foremost, as belonging to Jesus - not just on Sunday but our whole lives long.

Our celebration will begin with the opening hymn *On Jordan's Bank the Baptist's Cry*. It was new to many of us when we sang it last year so here is a link to follow to get a preview from the choir of St. John's College, Cambridge, England:
