I'm also asking the Session, in its meeting next week, to consider how we distribute communion elements and how we gather for congregational meals.

Certainly all of you who will volunteer for the backpack food event this Sunday at 5pm, please make sure that you are not coughing or sneezing and that you wash your hands as frequently as necessary.

Lastly, please be aware of anyone in our church community that may become ill and let me or a member of the pastoral care committee know about it. We most certainly don't want anyone to experience this illness shut-in alone.

As in all things, please remember that no matter how difficult the days before us become, God is with each of you and that nothing in life nor in death can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus.
