Dear Friends.

As I'm sure you are aware our nation passed a grim milestone this past weekend. We have now lost over 300,000 of our fellow Americans. I know some of them were your friends and perhaps even relatives. My thoughts and prayers are with you. I know the pain of dealing with the untimely death of a loved one. It's a different kind of grief from the loss of someone who is ready for their next adventure.

So far, the warnings of a second surge have been accurate. There is no reason to believe these same experts are wrong when they warn/predict January and February could well be the worst months of this pandemic. Hospitals and health care workers are already being pushed beyond their capacities. This will only get worse as infections continue to rise.

Your session met Monday night to discuss how to respond to this surge in COVID-19 infections and increases in hospitalizations and deaths. After much conversation it was decided to immediately suspend in-person worship beginning this Sunday, December 20th and extending through the end of January.

Regrettably, this includes our Christmas Eve services and in-person committee meetings as well. We are encouraging our committees to meet via Zoom through January. As of right now Shirley and I will still be in the church office.

This decision was not made lightly but made in love for our members. The numbers are staggering. It was with these realities in mind that we made our decision. We do so with regret. We all miss being together on Sunday mornings. But I believe it is the right and loving thing to do. And I don't regret that.

So, we will continue to livestream Sunday morning worship. We are still debating about the Christmas Eve service. Do we prerecord so members can watch it at a time that fits into their schedule or do we go with a livestream on Christmas Eve at 5PM? We will let you know what we know when we know it.

Your session with your property committee taking the lead (thank you Rob Marsh) is looking into installing the necessary equipment to continue livestreaming our worship service even after the pandemic is in our rearview mirror.

We all agree livestreaming is here to stay so we need to act accordingly. Video and audio quality are high on our list. We will keep you informed as to our progress. Who knows what new ideas we will come up with about how to use this as a tool for ministry and to increase and upgrade our "digital footprint" so folks can follow us here?

I will end by saying all our decisions are contingent. They are based on the risk to the health and welfare of our members. With the virus now running rampant in our communities your session felt now was time to take these actions.

If the experts misjudge January's number and they are declining instead of surging, your session will reconsider our decisions. As I have said on several occasions lately, long-range planning is no longer spoken in terms of years but rather weeks and months (days maybe?).

So far, the infectious disease experts have been right more often than they have been wrong. I, regrettably, am expecting January and February to be as bad as they are predicting. I just don't want any of you to be among those who become a statistic. I like you just the way you are.
