Dear Friends,

I hope God has continued to bless you and your loved ones with good health.

Ash Wednesday is just a week away! My goodness.

Ash Wednesday, Wednesday, February 17th, begins the season of Lent with a public act of confession. As we begin this season of reflection we do so by acknowledging that we have all sinned and fallen short of God's glory, by repenting and turning to our loving creator.

Ash Wednesday developed in the medieval period as a time when penitent sinners were presented for church discipline during the season of Lent and to be reconciled with the community of faith on Maundy Thursday. Ash Wednesday also came to be the occasion for new believers to enroll in a period of preparation for baptism at Easter. For those who undertake spiritual disciplines, Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten fast.

Ashes are an ancient symbol of repentance, sorrow, and sacrifice. Traditionally, the ashes for this serve are made from the palm branches of the previous year; thus, the ashes and palms together frame the season of Lent.

In anticipation of Lent this year your Worship and Music Committee is putting together a Lenten packet for our congregation. This packet will include daily devotionals to guide you during this season of Lent. These were written by one of our own, Roger Gench.

The packets will also include a small package of ashes for Ash Wednesday and a small palm cross. We hope you will find these devotionals helpful during your Lenten journey this year.

I want to thank all of you who participated in our Souper Bowl Sunday challenge. Y'all performed better than the Chiefs did. But like I said before, the real winners are those whom your gifts will feed and nourish.

But wait! There's more! This coming Sunday is also the second Sunday of the month when we collect food for the Good Samaritan food pantry. I have been putting the collection back outside the Fellowship Hall this week and we have had a number of donations dropped off already.
