I trust you were able to be a part of our Ash Wednesday service yesterday. As I was live streaming, I could see names of folks who were watching scroll by. Thank you for participating. I yearn for the day when we can worship again with each other in person. Which brings me to my next item for today.

At our Session meeting this past Monday night, it was decided to lift the current restrictions on in-person gatherings and return to the protocols we were observing prior to our going virtual in mid-December.

Beginning Monday March 1st, committees, Circles, and other church gatherings may resume in-person meetings. This of course includes Sunday worship as well. Until then we will continue to worship virtually, and committees will continue to meet via Zoom through the end of February.

This is good news, but I do want to raise a word of caution. We are by means out of the woods with this pandemic. We must remain vigilant in our efforts to do what we can to not spread the virus. The emergence of new strains makes these simple measures even more critical as weapons against this virus.

Your session and I will continue to monitor the pandemic and will act accordingly and inform you of any changes to our protocols.


